"The Royal Artillery Charities have always been there for me and leave me with a feeling that there is always someone there for me. The charities could not do more to support me and I will always be eternally grateful."

"I would like to take this opportunity to sincerely thank you for the financial support you have extended to my family. My brother's sudden death came as a shock to all of us.

I had been saving to apply for British citizenship and to prepare for my transition out of the Army; as I approach 22 years of service next year.

However, I had to use those savings to cover the costs of my flight and my brother's funeral arrangements.

Your generosity will play a crucial role in helping me achieve one of my personal goals this year — and that is obtaining British citizenship. I am sincerely thankful for the assistance of my Regiment and will always remember your support."

"I am writing to express my deepest gratitude for the generous financial support you have provided to me during this difficult time. Your kindness has made a significant difference in my life, and I am truly thankful for the help.

The challenges I've been facing have been overwhelming, and your contribution has alleviated some of the financial burden, allowing me to focus on regaining stability. It's comforting to know that there are organizations like yours that step in and support soldiers and individuals like me, when they need it most.

I will hopefully be able repay the favour, so you are able to continue supporting soldiers who need it. Thank you!"

Now I am fully independent and able to come and go as I please, I can attend my Armed Forces and Veterans coffee mornings and my monthly Parkinson's Club. Please convey my sincere thanks to all those involved in making this possible, you have prevented a year that was turning out to be a "Annus Horribilious" as our late Queen stated — and transformed it into something special. You have made a veteran very happy and given me my independence back which has reduced the amount of stress that I was suffering. Once again THANK YOU, THANK YOU. Once again, I can't stop saying it! Thank you from one very happy veteran."

"I would like to personally thank you from myself and my family for your generous contribution to support my son in gaining an assessment of his additional needs.

Your help will hopefully improve his future and open more opportunities and support for him that is much needed. Seeing first-hand as a serving soldier what the RA Charities can offer has been eye-opening as I was previously unaware of it even being an option for my situation. I will be sure to spread the word on the good work and support the charities can offer. Thank you again."

"I served in the Royal Artillery for 24 years, deploying to Northern Ireland, Cyprus, Iraq and several tours of Afghanistan.

Towards the late stages of my colour service ending, I lost my mother to cancer, then a year later went through a difficult divorce where my life became very bleak. I began to suffer with severe anxiety, depression, trust and mental health issues; 'thinking what was the point?'

On the date of my colour service ending, I was no longer entitled to accommodation and was therefore homeless. Nowhere to live, no job, divorce ongoing, alone, life was very bad.

A close friend and colleague advised me to contact the RA Charities for assistance. It was one of the hardest things to do, but I asked for help.

I was only homeless for a week and living in a cheap hotel, when the charities contacted me, informing me that I had been accepted to live in one of the Royal Artillery Houses.

This has been so positive and amazing. It is taking me time, but I am slowly rebuilding my life, after losing everything.

The Royal Artillery housing has helped me to find a job, and this has enabled me to help others in education, get a dog — which is a great emotional support, and having a home gives me purpose, security and helps keep my anxiety and depression in check.

I cannot thank everyone enough for the help, assistance and kindness they have shown continuously shown. Without the support of the RA Charities, I believe I may not have been here today."

FROM THE WORDS OF A RA OFFICER

"I am a serving Royal Artillery Officer with over 40 years service. My wife was diagnosed with stage four colon cancer in February 2023. It came as a huge shock and changed our lives overnight.

She was offered standard treatment from the NHS; which we knew was not going to change the outcome, but hopefully would prolong her life. As time went on, it was clear that we needed something in addition to the standard NHS course of treatment.

We researched private treatment options which were available. A clinic in Frankfurt offered to care for her, although very expensive, we felt we had no choice but to take it.

My Commanding Officer asked why I had not made any enquires for financial assistance from the RA Charities. I personally felt that it was there to support soldiers and their families — not officers like me.

I was encouraged to make contact with the RA Charities and when I did, the support was both immediate and very welcome.

We received financial support which assisted with our travel and hotel expenses; which took the pressure off us both at a very difficult time.

We visited the clinic in Frankfurt for treatment five times over the course of five months; each with the support of the welfare charity. Sadly my wife lost her life in May 2025.

On reflection the support we received was outstanding — always helpful and extremely dignified. If I have learnt anything from my recent experience, it is that the RA Charities are there for all of us and all ranks 'must' be encouraged to ask for assistance when

they need it."

Deployments are intense and demanding, so ensuring our soldiers have time to decompress and are better able to integrate into life back in the UK is essential.

Through Ex UBIQUE BOOMERANG we provide a safe and controlled environment for personnel to rest, relax and recover from the operational tempo. Additionally, Ex UBIQUE BOOMERANG aims to provide an opportunity for personnel to recognise the importance of reflection whilst understanding the signs and symptoms of stress and moral injury in themselves and others.

Ex UBIQUE BOOMERANG takes place at Thorney Island Sailing Club where attendees take part in various water sports and other restorative activities.

This allows them to confide in each other in a secure setting and share experiences which they likely have been unable to do since return to the UK.

Up until then Rosie had been self-funding her professional career in the sport; to a detriment of her performances.


Rosie was hindered by a lack of competitive equipment, freedom of travel and a limited budget.

A grant funded the Regimental Historian, Dr Spencer Jones (senior lecturer at the University of Wolverhampton), who has provided expert historical advice. It has enabled a dynamic programme of RAHS seminars and webinars; reaching over 400 serving Gunners and RAHS members.



ASSUKED FUNDING

Funding was prioritised and assured by the RA Heritage Committee — ensuring value for money for the Regiment and reinforcing the importance of heritage within regimental life. This work would not be possible without the support of the Regimental charities.



1,000 GUNNERS VISITED THE RA COLLECTION

The RA Historical Society was assisted to support the professional development of RA officers on select career courses, which provided them with relevant historical campaign studies. The grant also facilitated visits by approximately 1,000 individuals, to the RA Collection at Wood Road.



FOSTERING CAMARADERIE

Additional grants via RHQ RA supported key heritage commemoration events; including central dinners in the RA Mess and Remembrance Sunday parades. These play an important role in fostering camaraderie within the serving and retired regiment.
